### **10 Women Demand Government Aid**

WASHINGTON, Sept. 27 -A non-partisan delegation of 10 Negro and white women from Buffalo today demanded that the Department of Agriculture give some of its sur-plus food to the needy in Buf-

The delegation was headed by Dorothy Haines, Socialist Workers candidate for Lieutenant Governor of New York, and Louise Ellis, SWP candidate for State Senator in the 55th District.

The 10 women, who arrived by automobile, were met in Secretary Benson's office by Roy W. Lennartson, deputy administrator of the Department's Agricultural Marketing Administration and Dr. Earl L. Butz, assistan secretary of agriculture.

"Buffalo has been designated NEGRO, PUERTO RICAN as a critical area of unemployment," Louise Ellis told the department representatives. "According to the last reports, there are 34,000 unemployed in Buffalo, with 16,000 families on relief. The Eisenhower administration has stored away in warehouses surplus food that is not being used.

"We are going to ask that the surplus food be distributed to the unemployed in Buffalo. It is being done in Pittsburgh, and there is no reason it can't be done in Buffalo."



When the life of a simple Japanese fisherman, Aikichi Kuboyama, flickered out on the night of Sept. 23, the whole world asked: Are we doomed? The death of this obscure worker from radiation sickness, caused by a U.S. Hydrogen bomb test explosion last March 1, has given tragic proof of the incalculable deadliness of the H-bomb.

Aikichi Kuboyama was one of 23 members of a fishing-boat crew who, as the daily press put it, were "dusted" with radioactive ash from an H-bomb set off more than 80 miles away. The word "dusted" gives an impression of a substance no more harmful than talcum powder. But bombs that can kill 80 miles from the blast point can wipe out

bomb set off last March. I read with chills in the N.Y. Herald-Tribune of Sept. 27 the report of the Alsop brothers that an H-bomb of the March 1 type "will destroy a circular area of 300 square miles by fire and blast. But it will probably expose an area of 6,000 square miles to lethal radiation." That means a curtain of death dropped over an area covering all of New York City, Newark, Jersey City, Hoboken and as far south as Philadelphia. Just 100 such bembs could wipe out the United States. But the merchants of death have not stopped there. An H-bomb with three times the explosive power of the March 1 device has been perfected.

A condensed version of "The Hydrogen Bomb," by James R. Shepley and Clay Blair, Jr., which appears in the Sept. 24 U.S. News and World Report, reveals that it had been planned to follow the March 1 blast with "a super-giant of all atomic bombs." But "new calculations pushed the giant bomb near the practicable limit of thermonuclear weapons, 45 megatons, 2,-400 times the force of Hiroshima." The risk to the U.S. bases and ships was so great that explosion of the new bomb was postponed for a later test in a greater expanse of the





DETROIT, Sept. 30 - The 108-day attempt of the Square D Company to smash Local 957 of the United Electrical Workers ended in defeat for the company today.

Although the 1,200 workers who had been on strike since the middle of June were forced to make heavy concessions they saved their union.

This was the feeling uppermost in the minds of the Square D workers when they voted today to accept an agreement negotiated with the company in

the past week, (A full analysis of the new contract will appear next week

in the Militant.) The setback to the company's mion-smashing plan, which had been followed with avid interest by Big Business from coast to coast, was made possible by the ntervention of rank-and-file unonists in the struggle. When Detroit's police were mobilized to run strikebreakers through the line and to club pickets, militants from plants in the area rallied to the aid of the

This was followed by a decaration of solidarity from 13 officials of local United Automobile Workers unions. They joined the pickets together with Flying Squadrons.

Yesterday the co-ordinating committee of the UAW contingents declared, "We are glad that the Square D strike is over, and that it has been shown that are not proper or feasible ways to settle a labor dispute."

The committee again scored the witch hunting with which the company, the press, the police and city and other government officials tried to build up hysteria against the Square D strikers.

"We believed the strike issues were legitimate, and we still do. We did not believe that this was 'push-button' strike of the Communist party and we still don't. . .

This statement was signed by Russell Leach, UAW Local 155; Ken Morris, Local 202; Carl Stellato, Local 600; Harry Southwell, Local 174; Syl Sumerack, Local 1227; and Paul Silver, Local 351.

The union-smashing attempt, coming during the election compaign, faced every candidate with the issue: For or against the strikers?

Frank Lovell, Socialist Workers candidate for governor of Michigan, challenged Democratic Governor Williams "to come down and march with the Detroit workers on the Square D picket line and see for yourself the scabherding being done by the Detroit police."

The SWP candidate told Williams: "You are the acknowledged leader of the Democratic party in this state, yet neither statement in protest against company and police department strikebreaking . . .

In a radio address over WJR on Sept. 22, Lovell repeated his challenge to Williams, stating:

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



## "Censure" Fascist Senator

I am running as the anti-McCarthy candidate in New Jersey. I know that both Howell and Case, my Democratic and Republican opponents claim to oppose McCarthyism. They are for war, for Jim Crow and for the witch hunt. They just don't want to go allout for a fascist solution, which would wipe them out along with all remnants of democracy.

Their main strategy against McCarthy is to try to outdo him in the fight against "Communism." In the closing session of the 83rd Congress they joined with all other Republicans and Democrats to rush through the Communist control bill and other witch-hunting and unionbusting measures.


